GRAND CORRUPTION AS A MAJOR OBSTACLE TO THE SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT GOALS

Grand corruption presents a serious threat to the fulfilment of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development. As a direct result of it, education, health and other development priorities remain underfunded, the natural environment is destroyed and fundamental human rights are violated. There is a range of ways to address grand corruption, from improved national legislation to a protocol to UNCAC to new international institutional arrangements, stronger and independent institutions and involvement of civil society and the private sector.

The panel will present case examples showing how grand corruption frustrates the achievement of the Sustainable Development Goals. It will also discuss Transparency International's new draft legal definition of 'grand corruption' and highlight the outcomes of the two global Expert Group Meetings held in Lima, Peru and Oslo, Norway on corruption involving vast quantities of assets.
