☐ Europe is the largest group; significant will to increase their involvement with the UNCAC Coalition.


 \square Almost half of the members (20/44), but only $\frac{1}{4}$ of the affiliated groups (13/50) and only 2 individual members responded the survey.


- Limited and unstable financial resources

• Members: 7 (20)


Affiliated groups: 3 (13)
