#### **1. Adoption of previous minutes**

The CCC adopted the minutes from the meetings of 25 November 2025 and 13 December 2025 without amendments.

#### **2. Follow-up on previous action points**

The MD presented the timeline for developing the Coalition's new strategy, including internal drafting, consultation with the Board and members, and potential discussion at a virtual General Assembly planned for May 2026. An update was also provided on the annual staff wellbeing survey, which will again be launched to gather feedback from the Secretariat team.

#### **3. CoSP11 recap**

The MD reported on the outcomes of CoSP11, noting strong civil society participation, a preparatory meeting with around 200 participants, and engagement by civil society representatives within government delegations. The Coalition contributed through statements, side events, and advocacy around resolutions. Secretariat staff presented an overview of the adopted resolutions, highlighting developments related to civil society participation, transparency around the IRM, and thematic areas such as political finance and environmental crime. Members reflected on the outcomes and emphasized the importance of follow-up and implementation.

#### **4. Coalition workplan for 2026**

The MD introduced the draft workplan for 2026, focusing on follow-up to recent UNCAC resolutions, continued engagement with the IRM, and work on thematic priorities, including political finance, environmental crime, and civic space. Organizational priorities include completing the rebranding process, advancing the new strategy, strengthening fundraising, and celebrating the Coalition's 20th Anniversary. Key international events for the year were also provided.

#### **5. Budget for 2026**

The MD presented an overview of the 2026 budget, noting that the minimum budget required for core operations has been secured, while additional funding will be needed to reach a more ambitious budget to cover all planned activities. Members discussed funding sustainability, donor engagement, and the implications of resource constraints.

#### **6. General Assembly and CCC elections**

The CCC agreed to hold the 2026 General Assembly virtually in May. The timeline for the 2026 CCC elections was also approved, including nomination, publication of candidates, and a voting period in early June. Members discussed the timing of elections and leadership transitions.

#### **7. Updates from the Vienna Hub and CCC members**

The Secretariat provided updates on ongoing initiatives, including preparations for the Coalition's 20th anniversary, the annual member activity survey, engagement with upcoming international events, and fundraising outreach. Staffing changes and administrative matters were also discussed. CCC members briefly shared updates from their organizations.

#### **8. Any other issues**

No additional issues were raised.
