Coalition Coordination Committee (CCC) Online Meeting Summary

1. Approval of Minutes:

The CCC approved the minutes from the previous CCC call on 21 October 2025.

2. Follow-Up on Previous Action Points:

The MD reported progress since the previous meeting. The main outstanding issue concerns regional coverage of the SWANA region, where no Regional Coordinator is currently in place. The MD will discuss continued informal coordination and support for regional engagement with the CCC SWANA representative for CoSP11.

3. Rebranding of the Coalition - Update

The MD updated members on the ongoing rebranding process. The Coalition will participate in the CoSP11 using its new full name and logo, The Global Civil Society Coalition for the UNCAC. The Coalition plans a gradual transition, with communication and guidance to be shared with members ahead of the CoSP to ensure consistent use. The MD also clarified that the website domain and email addresses will remain unchanged for now.

4. CoSP11 – Updates on preparations

The MD and the Hub Team briefed members on preparations, including the Civil Society Preparatory Day with over 200 registered participants, 34 Coalition written submissions, and around 20 side events led or co-sponsored by members.

- The MD highlighted the expectation for a high civil society participation in Doha, as well as shared the plans for a coordination briefing for individuals joining government delegations.
- CCC members were updated on ongoing resolution negotiations and guidance materials. Visa support and other logistical information are being shared with participants.

5. Draft Agenda for the In-Person CCC Meeting

The MD presented the draft agenda, noting that the meeting will focus on reviewing the current strategy, reflecting on the past year, and gathering input for the next strategy cycle. CCC members were invited to suggest priorities.

6. Membership applications

The CCC approved new members:

- the Albanian Institute of Sciences (AIS),
- Due Process Law Foundation (USA), and
- the Resource Justice Network (UK / Belgium) as ordinary member organizations;
- Tolotsoa (Madagascar) as an extraordinary member organization and Juan Pablo Olmedo (Chile) as an individual member.

Two additional organizations' applications were paused and require further information before being considered.

The Chair reflected on regional balance and encouraged outreach to underrepresented regions, particularly South Asia, where the number of active participating organizations remains low.

7. Alternate CCC

The Chair introduced a proposal submitted by a member of the CCC on allowing organizational alternates to participate in CCC meetings. Following a brief discussion, the CCC agreed to defer the matter to a future meeting, with one member requesting their opposition to allowing alternates to be recorded.

8. Updates from the Vienna Hub

The MD reported on the current funding status.

The MD expressed appreciation for CCC members' extensive contributions to advocacy, side events, and written submissions.

CCC members shared their updates, including a side event at the Inter-American Commission on Human Rights on corruption and human rights; the publication of Ghana's diagnostic report and progress toward a new national anti-corruption action plan; and the release of Pakistan's governance and corruption diagnostics report by the International Monetary Fund, which has received notable media attention.

9. Any Other Issues

With no further issues open for discussion.

Meeting closed.
